

Supporting the "YES" vote

AgZero2030 supports a 'Yes' vote for the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Voice Referendum. We support the Voice to get better outcomes in health, education, employment, housing, agriculture and climate change adaptation for First Nations communities. Constitutional support for the Voice will give the First Peoples of Australia the confidence to make the Voice an enduring and effective element of Australian government, supported by the whole of the Australian people.

There is a growing political consensus on having a legislated Voice enacted by the Australian Parliament so why not put that in the Constitution? The Voice Referendum will give the Australian people the chance to say that they support a legislated Voice, so that members of Parliament know such legislation must be enacted but can also be changed like any other legislation, reflecting the political will of the Australian people from time to time.

Primary Industries in the Energy Transition: Market Incentives

In February, AgZero 2030 hosted a gathering at Point Walter Perth, where 80 attendees converged to delve into the intersection of primary industries and the energy transition.

The participation of Minister for Agriculture and Food Jackie Jarvis in opening the event underscored the importance of collaborative efforts between governmental bodies and private enterprises in driving sustainability within primary industries.

By harnessing the collective expertise of its guest speakers, AgZero sought to deliver the latest insights on global and national climate trends, energy transition dynamics and their impact on primary industry supply chains.

Emphasising market incentives and opportunities for producers, the event aimed to facilitate proactive engagement with the energy transition.

- John Connor, CEO, Carbon Market Institute: An update on outcomes from the 2022 climate and biodiversity COPs shed light on the global progress in climate negotiations. His insights encompassed the ACCU review, safeguard mechanism, carbon and nature-based solutions markets and the forthcoming Australian Carbon Exchange.
- Alana Hollestelle, Director Markets and Supply Chains, CommonCapital: Valuable insights into market development pathways crucial for decarbonising Australia's primary industries. Her perspective highlighted practical approaches to navigating this complex transition.
- Crawford Taylor, Head of Sustainability, Rabobank Australia: An update on financial markets' role in the energy transition for primary industries outlined the evolving landscape of sustainable investments.
- David Stanko, Director Sustainability, Nutrien Ag Solutions Australia: Insights into fertiliser markets and their connection to the energy transition underscored the need for innovative approaches to sustainably manage resources in agriculture.
- Rob Waterworth, CEO, FlintPro Corp: An update on geospatial data solutions for measuring GHG emissions and natural capital provided attendees with a glimpse into cutting-edge technologies shaping sustainability practices.
- · Toby Wright, Head of Sustainability CBH: CBH Group's newly unveiled sustainability/ESG policy and targets showcased a major player in the industry taking tangible steps toward a greener future.




Shaping a Sustainable Path Forward


At the conclusion of the forum, AgZero 2030 took a proactive step by inviting participants to share their reflections.


This feedback mechanism serves as a two-way street, allowing attendees to express their thoughts while providing organisers with essential insights into the event's impact.


This invaluable feedback holds the key to not only refining future events but also to shaping a more effective climate response strategy.















































